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## 49 BILLS INTRODUCED

Renewable energy growth, opposition, and legislation have continued to be prominent topics of discussion in Oklahoma’s news sources. In 2025, 49 bills have been introduced around siting, setback, transmission infrastructure, and tax credits.

Bill Number	QR Code	Description
<u>SB1012</u> <i>In committee</i>		SB1012 establishes a waiver process for wind energy facility operators to pursue in constructing facilities that do not follow the setback requirements.
<u>SB618</u> <i>In committee</i>		SB618 mandates that public utilities create an energy alert system to communicate with county and municipal governments in the event of outages.
<u>HB2157</u> <i>Passed committee</i>		HB2157 establishes that it is the intent of the legislature to develop a strategy designed to encourage renewable energy development "in a way that works in harmony with farming and ranching."
<u>SB612</u> <i>In committee</i>		SB612 requires public entities to develop energy security plans, which will include preparations for service disruptions and public notice procedures.

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## KEY THEMES

Upon review of the proposed legislation, five main topics emerged: wind, solar, siting and setback, transmission and utilities, and renewables generally. Other topics included carbon capture, oil and gas, tax credits, nuclear energy, and administrative procedures.
